1. Introduction

One of the activities for the “Building Safe and Resilient Communities” Project was “Demographic/general baseline and gender analysis surveys” in all targeted communities. General Baseline Survey was conducted and the report developed in June-July 2016. It was also planned to conduct the Gender Analysis Survey and incorporate the results in Baseline Survey Report.

This Gender Analysis Survey for the “Building Safe and Resilient Communities” Project was conducted by the Village Volunteer Groups (VVG) of Azerbaijan Red Crescent Society in October –November 2016. Before the Survey the questionnaire developed and all 8 VVGs trained by the project staff. The Gender Analysis Report comprises main findings, recommendations and questionnaire used in the Survey. These recommendations should be considered when implementing activities and designing future activities.

In total 173 beneficiaries were interviewed by the VVGs. 66 out of 173 interviewees were women. Interviews were mainly conducted face to face. Table 1 provides a breakdown of the location of the interviewed beneficiaries.

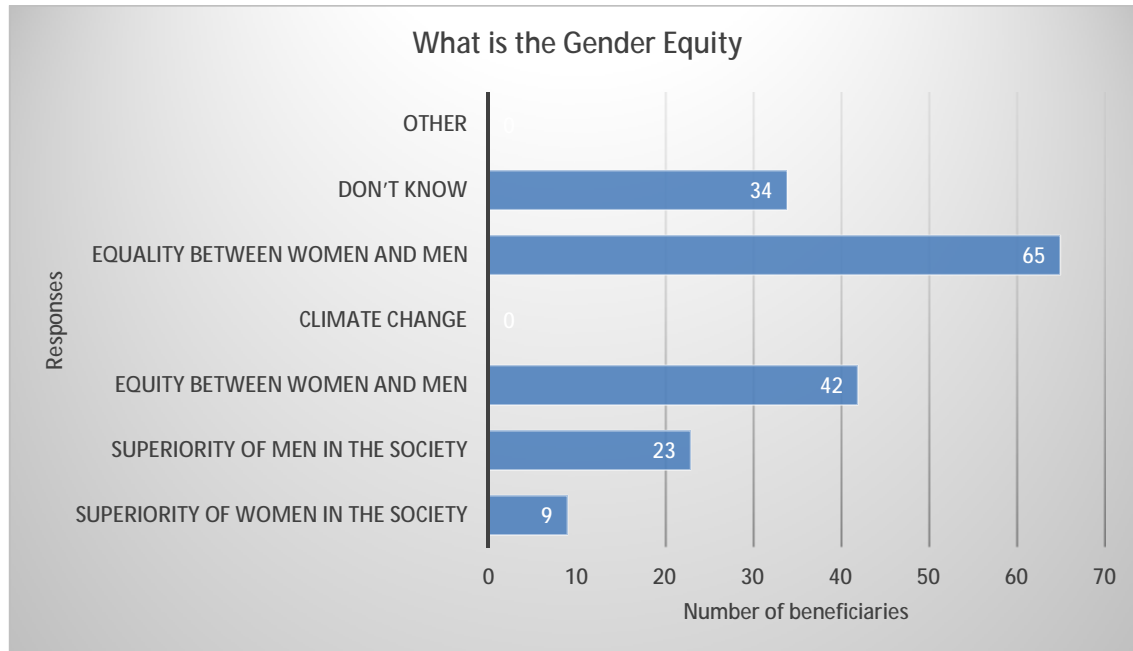

The results were processed using excel, and the results and analysis are shown in this report.

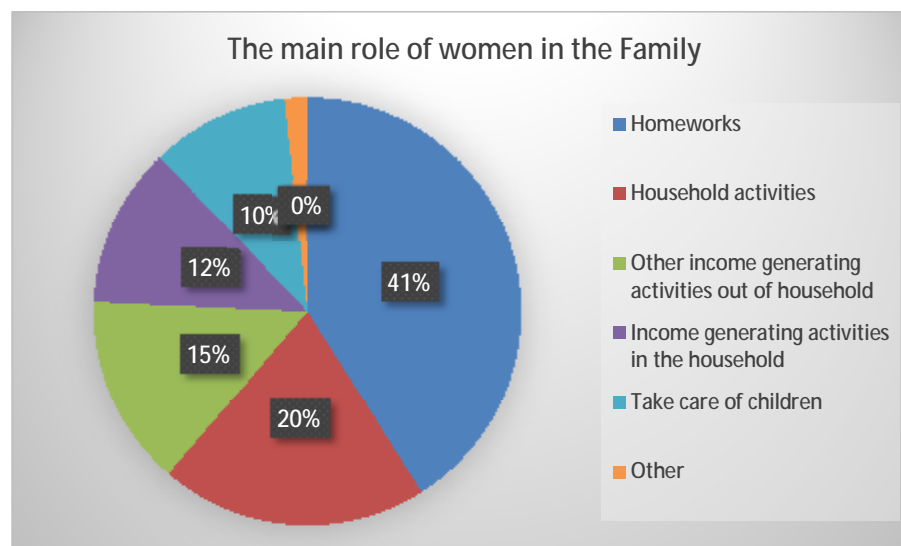
2. Results

1. What is the Gender Equity?



The above graphs show that understanding of Gender Equity among the beneficiaries in the target villages is not low as expected. Thus, 42 people out of 173 interviewed know an exact definition of the Gender Equity. However, the most beneficiaries consider the Gender Equity as a Balance (Equality) between women and men, which is not correct.

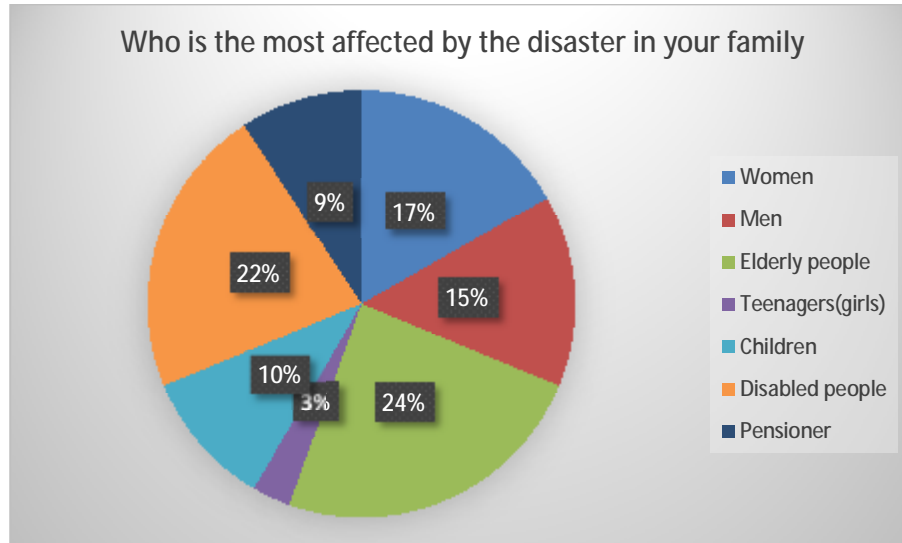
2. The main role of women in the Family



The main roles of the women in the target villages are Homework and Household activities, which are still inherent in rural regions of Azerbaijan.

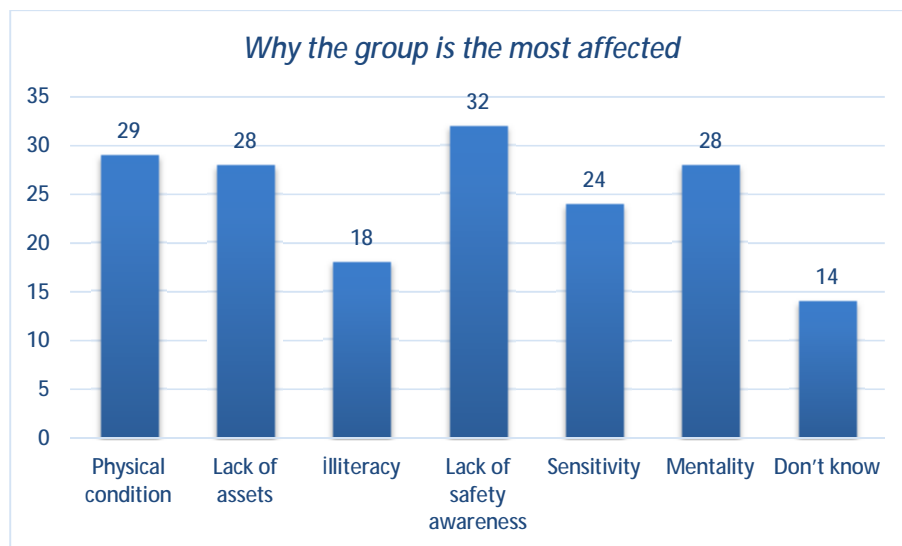
15% of the women in the families work outside the household. The most of them work at the education institutions.

3. Who is the most affected by the disaster in your family?



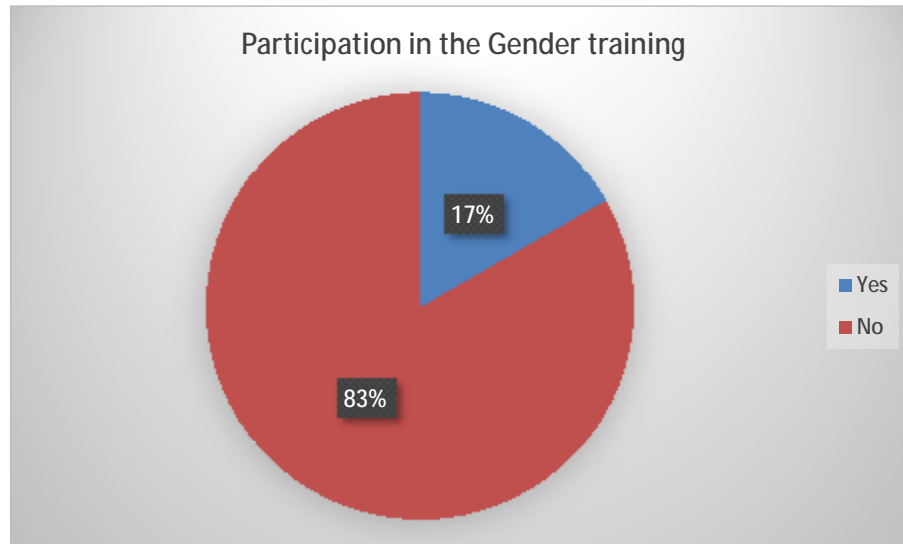
The above graph shows that 24 % elderly people, 22% disabled people, 17% women are the most disaster affected people. It means the common vulnerability in the target areas are still high.

4. Why the group is the most affected by the disaster?



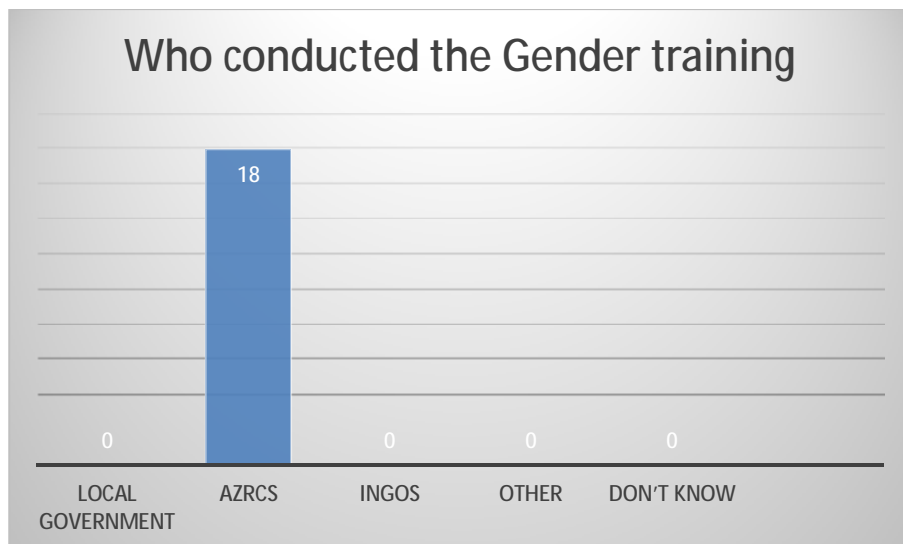
The most interviewer explain that the reason of the vulnerability of the above mentioned groups are Lack of safety awareness, Physical condition and Mentality. 14 people out of 173 interviewed don't know the reason of it.

5. Have you or anyone from your family taken part in Gender related trainings?



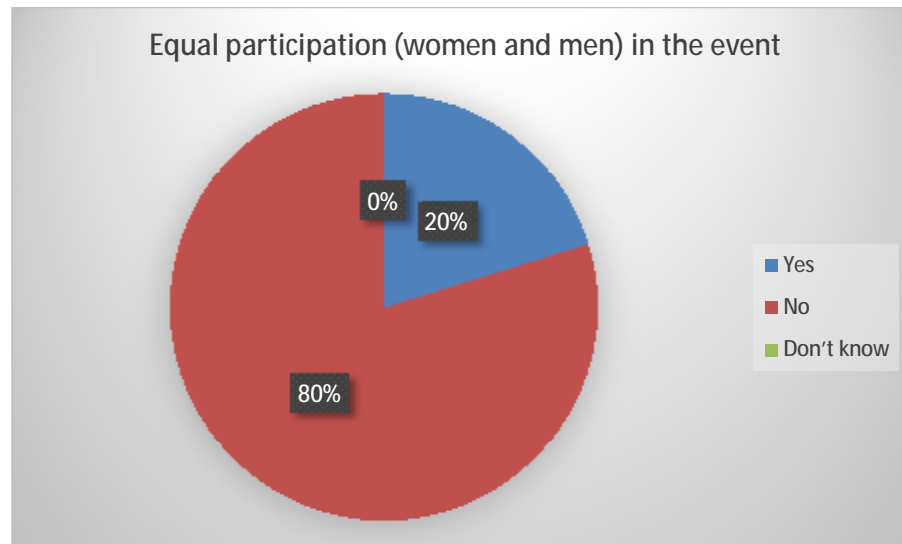
The above graph shows that only 17% of the people have taken part in the Gender related trainings. It assumes that these trainings were conducted by the AzRCS within the "Building Safe and Resilient communities".

5.1 Who conducted the Gender trainings?



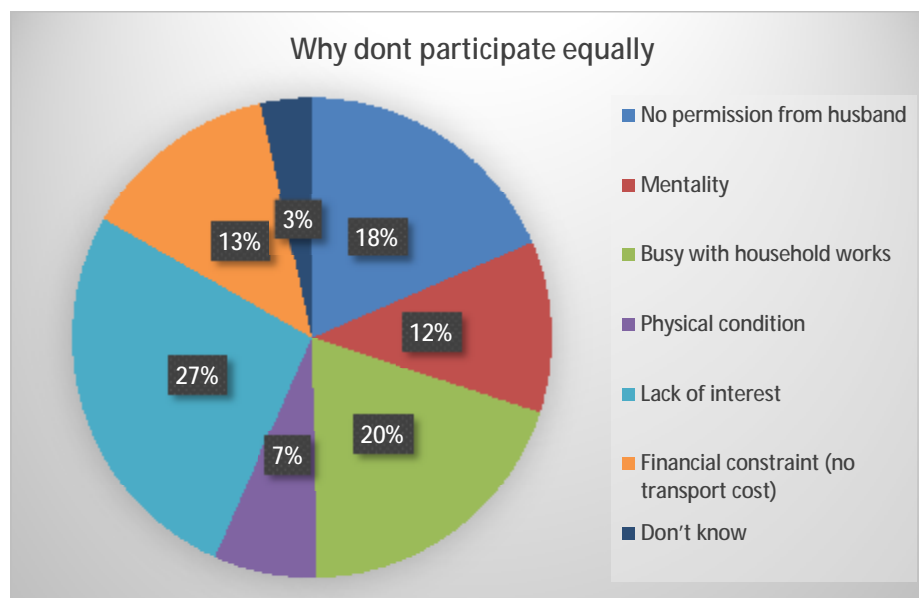
18 people confirm that the Gender related trainings have been conducted by the AzRC.

6. Do women and men in your family participate in the any event equally?



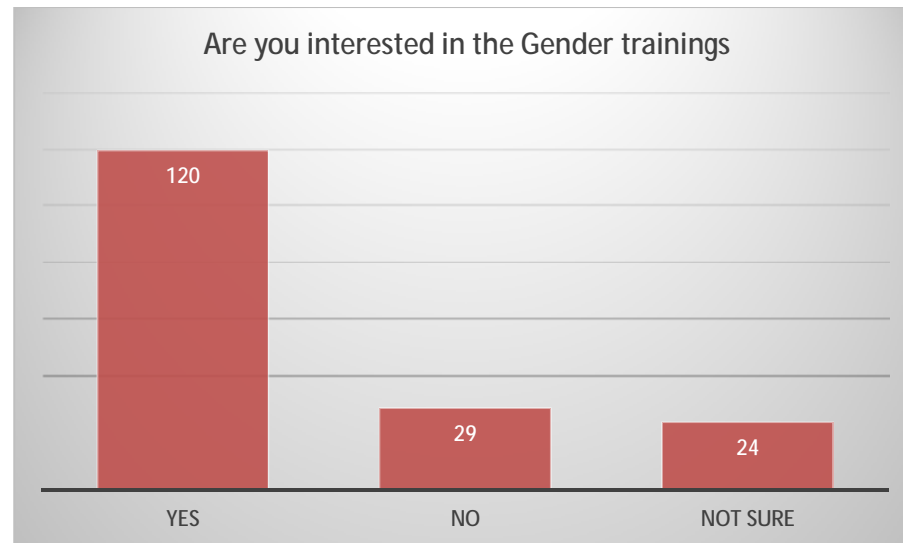
The result of the Survey shows that the majority of the women don't participate in the events equally. Only 20% of the women and men participate together in the events. The most of these women usually work at the education institutions.

6.1 Why women and men don't participate in the events equally?



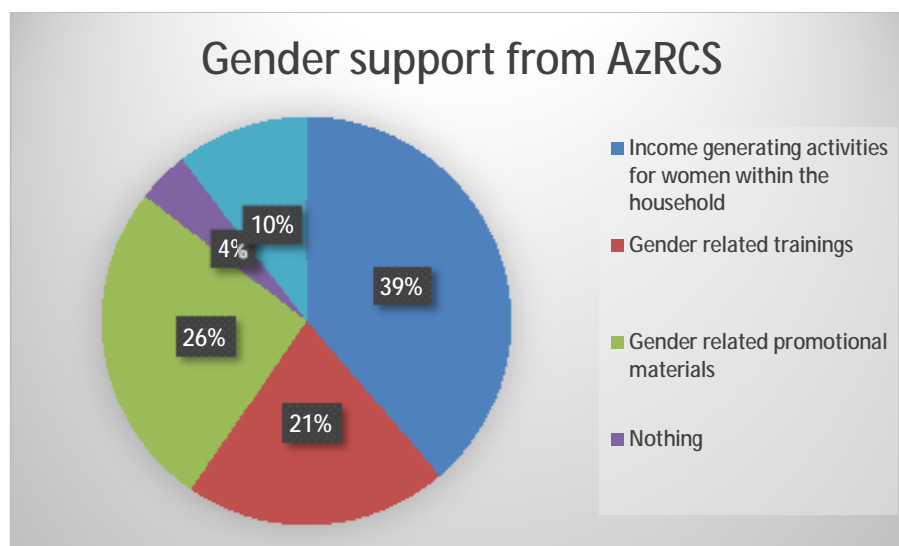
The reasons of the “why women and men don't participate in the events equally” are mainly “lack of interest”, “busy with the household works” and “no permission from husband”.

7. Would you like to know more about Gender equity?



The above graph shows that 120 people out of 173 are interested to know more about the Gender Equity”

8. What kind of Gender related support would you asked from AzRCS?



39% and 26% of the respondents are interested in the “Income generating activities for women within the household” and “Gender related promotion materials” respectively.

3. Analysis and recommendations

Analysis of the finding show that Gender understanding among the respondents is not low, but needs to be expanded. Women within the communities mostly involved in the household works. Only few percent of the women work outside of the household for the income generation purposes.

The most disaster affected people in the target villages are still elderly, disabled people and women. It means that the community based DRR intervention is still needed to reduce the vulnerabilities, which could be provided mainly through awareness activities.

A few percent of people have participated in the Gender related training and the women do not take part in the events together with the men. Majority of women are not interested in the training, as they are busy with the household works. However, women mainly are interested in the Gender related promotion materials and Income generating activities with the household.

The following activities are suggested to promote Gender Equity in the target villages:

- Distribution Gender Equity promotion materials with the purpose to expand coverage of those who involved into the proses;
- Contribute implementation income generating activities for women within the households by means of advocating this issue before stakeholders and decision makers;
- Active promotion of Gender Equity understanding, acceptance and perception through awareness events;
- Support the communities with better involvement into the Gender Equity issue by means of time to time organized trainings
- Jointly contribute implementation of the community based DRR projects through advocacy related activities
